VARIETY	DESCRIPTION
BLACK JACK	Attractive garden tree. Its bold branching structure has an interesting winter appearance. Especially sweet, elongated purple fruit produced in summer. Semi-dwarf form makes it a good choice where space is limited. Can be maintained at 6' or to 15' tall and wide. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
BLACK MISSION	Taste standard for figs. Medium to large, pear shaped fruit with rough, purplish black skin. Sweet, strawberry-red flesh with a distinct rich flavor. Finest quality fruit is great for drying, fresh eating and canning. Heavy bearing, June through frost. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
BROWN TURKEY	Medium to large, elongated fruit with brownish maroon markings. Fine grained, sweet, juicy, firm, meaty flesh with a sugary, rich flavor. Excellent for jams, drying or eating fresh. Handsome, low bushy plants grow 10' tall, but can be pruned. Bears June through frost. Selected for its high fruit quality. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
GARNSEY WHITE SEEDLESS	A seedless fig. Medium to large, light yellow flesh, thin skinned. Fruit ripens in summer. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
KADOTA	The leading commercial canning variety. Medium sized fruit with thin, tough, light greenish-yellow skin. White to amber is tinged with pink. A rich, sweet, flavorful all-purpose fig, great for canning, fresh eating or preserving. Long-lived vigorous tree bears June through frost. Very productive. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
PANACHE	This exciting variety has yellow/ivory fruit with green striping. Flesh is red and has a very good taste. New branches are also variegated. Fruit ripens July-October. Self-fertile. Interesting conversation piece!
PETER'S HONEY	Especially sweet, greenish-yellow fruit each summer. Needs hot exposure to ripen in coastal areas. Moderate grower to 15-25 feet tall and wide. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
WHITE GENOA	Large fruit has a thin, greenish-yellow skin, with amber to yellow, flavorful flesh. Good for eating fresh. Bears June through frost. Produces well in Southern Calif. coastal areas. Self-fertile, hardy to 10 degrees F. Requires approximately 100 chill hours.
